Summary

The Authority's Standing Orders (paragraph 25) provide that: at a meeting of the Authority, any member of the public can put a maximum of one question per meeting to the Chair of the Authority about matters for which the Authority is responsible; the Chair shall supply answers to all questions published with the agenda to the Head of Legal and Democratic Services not less than one hour before the commencement of the meeting; that a maximum of two supplementary questions arising directly out of the reply will be allowed by the Chairman, to be asked by the original questioner; and that question time is restricted to 20 minutes.

Notice of any question must be given in writing to the Head of Legal and Democratic Services by 2.30pm, six clear working days before the meeting of the Authority. Questions must be accompanied by a copy of any document to which they refer. The Head of Legal and Democratic Services will disallow questions which he/she considers to be unrelated to the functions of the Authority; frivolous; derogatory to the dignity of the Authority; relates to the employment of an individual or ongoing litigation or which is substantially the same as a question, motion or deputation which has been put at a meeting of the Authority in the past six months. If a question is rejected, the questioner will receive a written response advising of this, including the reasons for the rejection. All questions received from the public and not disallowed by the Head of Legal and Democratic Services shall be published in the order in which they have been received with the agenda of the meeting of the Authority.

(i) **Question 21** From Mr Peter Ulrich

Given that Clerkenwell Fire Station was taken off the market in April 2016 - now 18 months ago - to allow the Mayor to consider how best it can contribute to the urgent need for new housing in London, when will a decision be taken on its future?
